#### WORDS OF ENCOURAGEMENT

#### Just Show Me Jim Fleming, Interim Senior Pastor

For they themselves report about us what kind of a reception we had with you, and how you turned to God from idols to serve a living and true God, and to wait for His Son from heaven, whom He raised from the dead, that is Jesus, who rescues us from the wrath to come (1 Thessalonians 1:9-10).

As I was growing up, my dad, Charlie was the foreman for crews that would build things like roads and sewer lines. Working with the local union of Operating Engineers was just one of the challenges he faced. If he needed a bulldozer operator, he would call the union hiring hall and they would send him the next man on the list. Some would come loudly proclaiming their talent, their words often betrayed by a disappointing performance. His standard reply was always, "Just show me."

In the case of the Thessalonians, they had been living for their idols. But when Paul came to town, they made a decisive turnaround. The expectation of Jesus' return had become the defining feature of their lives. To observe them was to conclude: These people really do believe that Someone is coming who will rescue them as they live all-out for God.



What God did (and continued doing) among the Thessalonians was so amazing, so compelling, that it got the entire town's attention. Words were not needed because their living illustration was so powerful. What would it be like to experience this; to be a part of something so real, so dramatic, that it doesn't need to be argued for or defended; a powerful moving of God so arresting that the illustration does all the talking?

We live in a world of Charlies. They want to see the real thing. The God who breathed life into saints in Thessalonika can do the same here in Memphis, TN. Ask Him to start with you! Ask Him to make your life the answer to a world that says, "Just show me."





Since he was a young boy, Jeffery Johnson, our Recreation and Fellowship Director, has dreamed of playing professional basketball. Last spring it appeared a door was opening for him to potentially play pro ball in Europe; Valencia, Spain



That afternoon, playing in a pickup basketball game, Jeffery went up to take an alley oop pass and by the time his feet returned to the floor his plans had been drastically altered. A snap and searing pain in his knee would later be diagnosed as a torn patellar tendon. Two surgeries and months of intense rehab would follow. It seemed the door was closed on Jeffery's dream.

In our worship service on December 26, Jeffery shared this story with us. He challenged us to be willing to step out on faith, trust God, and let go of the plane (a reference to a skydiving experience he'd had). This week, Jeffery sent Taylor Park an email in which he said, "I am taking my own advice. I am excited to share that the opportunity to play professional basketball in Valencia, Spain has once again presented itself. I am on track to make a full recovery within the next few months and I plan on seizing this moment." Jeffery will play in the EuroProBasket summer league with the hope of a contract offer either in Europe or the U.S. after the season.

We are very excited for this opportunity for Jeffery, but saddened that he is leaving our staff. Jeffery is an incredibly rare mix of talents. You won't often find an athlete, a coach, an artist, a writer, a published poet, and many other things all packaged together in one person who also fiercely loves Jesus. Jeffery will be sorely missed, but our prayers and blessings certainly go with Mandie and him.

# GLOBAL MISSIONS FOCUS PARTNERSHIP IN THE GOSPEL

The Global Missions Focus seeks to further the "partnership in the Gospel" that First Evan has with our National Ministry Partners. Since they more easily reach groups unreached by the Gospel than we can, our partnership serves to advance the goal of "making disciples of all nations."

World Relief Memphis comes alongside refugees and other immigrants in vulnerable situations as they rebuild their lives in the United States. In 2012, the Memphis office opened, and they have been welcoming these international neighbors to the Bluff City ever since. First Evan has a history of supporting World Relief Memphis, both in terms of finances and volunteers.

The recent evacuation of Afghan families who were aligned with the United States military has created a

huge need for resettlement. World Relief Memphis intends to bring in dozens of families over the next 12 months. These families have been vetted and have been given special residency and employment status in the United States.

The goal for this project is two-fold: 1) Raise at least \$20,000 to assist with this resettlement effort, and 2) Create opportunities for our FEC families to have direct involvement with these families moving to our community.



#### God Always Goes Before Us Alex and Amy Galloway Novo/SentWell, Spain

We were riding a wave of momentum when we last visited First Evan for the 2020 missions conference. Just two weeks later, the entire world shut down for the pandemic, and we, along with our college-aged children, went into lockdown in a borrowed home, and the world entered a weird COVID-limbo.

But we have good news! God has not been caught off guard by this na-



Our ministry in Southern Spain is to provide emotional and spiritual care for missionaries on the field. We provide preventative and crisis care through retreats, counseling, and training. In the year before the pandemic, we turned away 151 missionaries for care.

Apparently, God knows the need for missionary care is only going to in-

crease in coming days, because surprisingly, the momentum we had going into 2020 did not slow; in fact, it hit warp speed! In 2020 alone, we received TEN new team members. We hadn't had ten new team members in the last 10 years!

Then, in 2021, after looking for years for a property for retreats and missionary care, a perfect house surfaced with an adjacent lot for expansion. Then as we began to share with donors, God brought in \$650,000 in November and December alone. We are nearly halfway to the money needed for this center, praise God!

While the rest of the world has been in lockdown, God has been rapidly arranging things here to expand our staff and facilities so that when the dust clears from the pandemic, we will be strategically positioned to provide for the sobering challenges that we see on the horizon.

As we face 2022 still needing to raise \$800,000, we are clinging to Isaiah 65:24 which says, "Before they call I will answer; while they are still speaking I will hear." Be encouraged that despite what we see around us, God is going BEFORE us in these extraordinary days.
