

GOING/SENDING Into the Fields... The fields are ready for the Harvest! Are we ready?

Jesus tells us in five different "commissioning" statements, from the time He rose from the dead to the time He ascended into heaven, that His disciples should "make disciples of all nations." Once we belong to Him, we are His disciples.

The theme verse for Global Missions this year is based upon one of these "commissioning" statements, Mark 16:15... "Go into all the world and proclaim the gospel to the whole creation." As a church, we want to consider what our roles are in this commissioning by Jesus. Our prayer is for every First Evan member to be involved in the GOING or the SENDING of others into the glorious work of making disciples world-wide!



We know that Jesus is our first example of the One who was sent, and that He has sent US to be His disciplemakers. This world-wide commissioning extends from where we live to where the least-reached live. As disciplemakers, we certainly have opportunities locally. One of our National Partner couples, **Gabor and Edina Gresz, will be leading us in training on Saturday morning, November 18**, about "Becoming a CoJourner." We will be given tools for gospel conversations where we play, live, learn, and work. It is open to everyone from middle school to adults of all ages, so plan now to join us!

As the Spirit equips us to be disciplemakers, we look for God-opportunities to share. While evangelism and outreach take us to the lost in our community who do not believe in Jesus, Missions compels us to be a part of taking the Gospel to those who, because of barriers like language, persecution, or lack of access, do not know there is a Jesus to believe in. In the local cultural context, most of those barriers are not present. In Missions, we purpose to cross barriers in order to take the Gospel to the least-reached peoples of the nations—both among us and to the world abroad!

We are excited to bring to you **Dr. George Murray on November 19** and again in late February, to help further consider our role in the Great Commission. In February, we will also be **joined by Pastor Antonio Muñoz**, on staff at Redeemer Community Church in Katy, TX, and a graduate of Moody Bible and Dallas Seminary. He will also be encouraging us as we consider our roles in GOING/SENDING.

We are prayerfully working to offer a variety of opportunities to GO and opportunities to SEND. These may be one week, one month, one year, or longer opportunities, and tailored to various occupations, skill sets, and locations. We hope that as a church, we will collectively seek the Lord, and ask what our role is in the world-wide proclamation of the Gospel. And, we remember that "world-wide" may be on the other side of the globe OR crossing barriers of language or culture right here in the Memphis area.

May the LORD guide and bless our efforts!

"A Dog Named Speed" by Larry Fitzgerald



"Poetry of Life: From a Biblical Perspective"



My father, Ken McIntosh, 94, a longtime member of First Evan, has published a book of verse, "Poetry of Life from a Biblical Perspective." The 230 poems were written over a 20 year period during my father's quiet times.

Many of the poems such as "Praying Through My Hymnbook" or "Why I Believe Christ Is the Only Way" are devotional or apologetic in nature. Other poems celebrate Christian holidays like "Christmas a Time of Wonder, a Time to Ponder."

Much of his work, such as the poem "When Tragedies Strike," was written to encourage those facing suffering, loss, death and grief.

For many years my mother, Nancy McIntosh, sent his poems to family and friends in cards or with strawberry bread to celebrate an occasion or encourage someone who was grieving, caregiving or facing their own health problems,



When my mother died in 2019, we decided to publish the poems in a book, which is available through *Amazon*.

Often when I visit my father at his residence at the Brookdale, he is sitting in a chair, reading his own book, encouraging himself and reminding himself of all of the promises of God.

Year-End Support for Missionaries

With the Christmas season preparations and end of the year approaching, I wanted to give a reminder of some different possibilities for yearend giving at First Evan. The Ministry Fund is our primary means of supporting our ministries, the staff, and the church building. But there are also possibilities to support missions and these must be designated when giving. Pass-Through allows First Evaners to give directly to any of our approved missionaries by name, and 100% of such a gift is passed directly to their missions organization. Additionally, there is the Missions Fund and through it we give a monthly stipend to our missionaries and national partners, we consider special projects of our missionaries in which to invest, and we support the outreach efforts of our Memphis Ministries partners.

Some recent examples of approved projects include: money sent to support Pastoral training in India and South Sudan, a leadership training retreat for In-Life in the Czech Republic, assistance for several missionaries making trans-continental moves, among other projects.



As Thanksgiving approaches we also have the opportunity to give toward a Thanksgiving Offering. This provides an additional year-end gift to all our missionaries.
